POOL: COVID-19 POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR 2020

The following policies are being implemented for the 2020 season as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. These changes are in line with recommended best practices from the aquatics industry, local and Commonwealth regulations, as well as guidance from the CDC and USA Swimming. Please note that it is believed the virus cannot survive in properly treated pools, nor is water believed to be a transferable substance. With that said, failing to maintain proper social distancing still presents risk while in and around the pool.

- When possible, all pool users and staff are expected to adhere to strict social distancing guidelines, maintaining no less than a six-foot distance from others.
- **All pool users and staff are required to wear a face-covering mask when unable to maintain a six-foot distance while at the facility**, when not swimming. The CDC does not recommend wearing a mask when swimming.
- Every pool user aged 18 years and older must present a photo ID and Naushop rec tag with 2020 sticker affixed upon arrival and sign a waiver every time they enter the premises. Every swimmer under the age of 18 must have an adult sign the waiver for them.
- Family blocks may only be comprised of residents (owners or renters) and houseguests actually staying in Naushop. **Casual visitors from outside Naushop are not permitted.**
- Pool users must reserve a 75-minute block of time with the staff (or using on-line apps if available) no less than an hour in advance and no more than one day in advance. These 75-minute blocks will be followed by a 15 minute period in order to allow staff to disinfect high touch surfaces, wash hands, and treat the pools as necessary. Families will be further limited to one block of pool time per day. The staff will strictly enforce the expiration of each pool session in order to allow for staff to focus on disinfecting duties between reservation blocks.
- Although pool users are welcome to arrive to their reservation block late, and to leave early, we ask that pool users not arrive early, or leave late.
- Prior to arrival, each family grouping will be assigned a designated sitting area at the pool to enjoy. The furniture in each sitting area may not be moved outside that area.
- When not swimming, we ask that family members do their best to remain in their designated sitting area. When swimming, please adhere to the six-foot distancing guidelines.
- The size of each family grouping may not exceed six, which corresponds to the number of rec tags allotted to each home.
- Strict six-foot social distancing rules must be maintained when swimming.
- The kiddie pool will be closed for the summer because of the limited ability to enforce social distancing.
- Staff will be testing the pools seven times each day, treating when necessary to ensure proper pH and disinfectant levels in accordance with local and national guidelines.
- Pool users will be asked to arrive at the pool in their swim attire. The outdoor shower will not be available for use. Please shower prior to arrival.
- To encourage social distancing, we ask that pool users follow a clockwise walking pattern around the pools when moving about the facility. Markers will be present to help encourage this pattern.

- Six-foot markers will also be placed around the staff chairs. We ask that members respect these boundaries when approaching staff. If you must approach the staff area, please wear a mask.
- As always, no lifeguard will be on duty, and all swimming will be at the swimmer's own risk.
- Any pool equipment and toys historically made available will be put away for the season. No toys, balls, flotation devices, or similar recreational equipment may be used in the pool. Face masks and goggles are permitted.
- No more than one lap swimmer per lane.
- Violators of these policies will be asked to leave immediately. Staff have sole discretion on the enforcement of these rules. The failure to leave and argumentative behavior will result in a call to the police. A second violation by any person shall result in the loss of privileges to use any of the amenities for the rest of the calendar year.

Additional General Guidance:

- Any employee or Naushop resident who has tested positive for COVID-19, displays symptoms or has been around anyone with the disease in the last two weeks should not enter the facility until they have safely ended their 14-day isolation.
- If you know it will be difficult for your child or any other member of your party to adhere to the above outlined policies, we ask that you please refrain from using the pool.
- Previously provided guidance regarding the use of the tennis courts and pickleball courts remains the same, except that all players will now be asked to sign the waiver before using any of the courts, with players under the age of 18 requiring the signature of a parent or guardian.
- The playground will be open for use in accordance with government guidelines. Once open, no more than two families may use the playground at a given time between disinfection. Access to the playground will be reserved in the same manner as tennis and Pickleball courts and also require signing a waiver.
